

## Elliott Ditch Project Update

Subject: Elliott Ditch Project Update No. 47 (4Q2021)

On behalf of Arconic Lafayette, LLC, Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc. (CEC) is pleased to provide this status update regarding the Elliott Ditch Project. As a reminder, project status updates will be provided weekly during clean-up activities and quarterly during non-clean-up activities, at a minimum. These updates will be posted on the updates section of the Elliott Ditch Project Website (http://elliottditchproject.cecinc.com/updates.aspx).

- Remediation activities were performed in the 2021 construction season in following locations:
  - ➤ Upper Reach 1
    - Intersection of Concord Road and Brady Lane to the Norfolk Southern's active railroad crossing (approximately 0.5 miles downstream of Arconic's Outfall 001).
  - ➤ Lower Reach 1
    - Between Norfolk Southern's railroad crossings (active and abandon railroad crossings);
  - Reach 2
    - From Norfolk Southern's abandoned railroad crossing to the South 18<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge;
  - Reach 3
    - On and near Duke Energy's property off of Ortman Lane within Elliott Ditch.
- The project risk-based remedial objective of 1.0 milligram/kilogram (mg/Kg) was achieved at all remedial locations (i.e., Upper/Lower Reach 1, Reach 2, and Reach 3).
- Tree planting activities were initiated in the beginning of December 2021 in accordance with the Habitat Mitigation Plan (Posted on the Project Repository *ED Floodway Mitigation Plan Revision 1 dated 1/21/2021*).
- CEC is preparing a project completion report summarizing remedial activities. The project completion report will ultimately be posted to the project repository and IDEM's Virtual File Cabinet for public review.
